Superintendent Alison Smith delivered the 2022-2023 Internal Audit Committee Report, summarizing the past fiscal year's activities and achievements, including completed audits in areas of maintenance, school-generated funds, and performance appraisal. Alison Smith, Superintendent of Business, Facilities, and Planning Services provided a review of the 2023 – 2024 Revised Estimates based on the October 31, 2023, enrolment report. The board's projected enrolment was 1,260 students, and the actual enrolment as of October 31 is 1,284 students, which is an increase of 24 students. The annual deficit is projected to be \$336,661 which is compliant with legislation. Smith reported that the majority of the deficit is attributed to inflation, utilities, and increases in benefit costs.

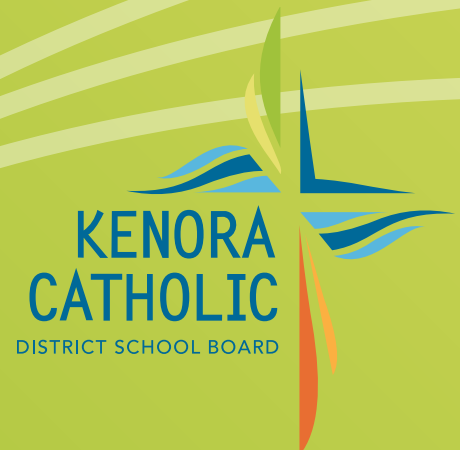

An Update on the Math Achievement Action Plan

KCDSB's Math Achievement Action Plan establishes consistent Math instruction, with a 65% adoption of a board-wide digital tool in Grade 3, 6, and 9 classrooms. Alongside professional learning and partnerships, the plan ensures meaningful support for students and educators emphasizing inclusivity and accessibility in numeracy and a strong commitment to ongoing progress.



Empowering Early Literacy for Future Success

KCDSB is well under way with implementing Acadience Reading, a comprehensive reading assessment tool to identify and support students with reading, and we've completed beginning-of-the-year literacy screenings in English and French for all students from Senior Kindergarten to Grade 2. This initiative, aligned with the Ontario Language curriculum, is focused on early detection and tailored interventions to equip all students with the skills and opportunities to become proficient readers. We're not just teaching reading; we're unlocking a world of possibilities for our students, one word at a time.



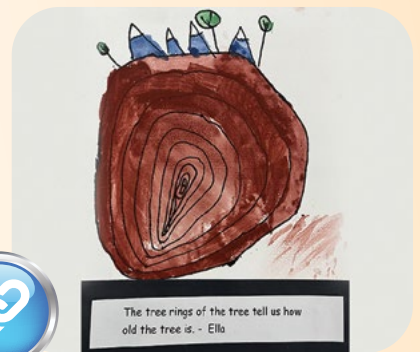
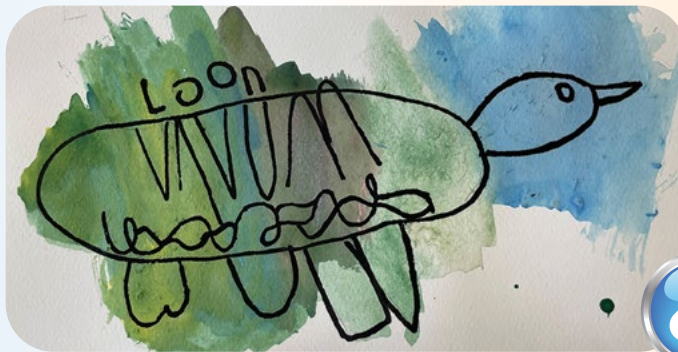
Advancing Mental Health Priorities Through Strategic Programing and Student Advisors

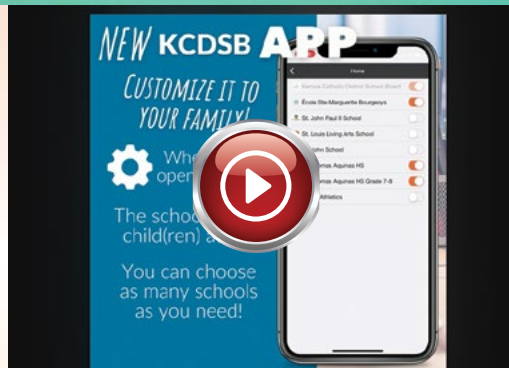

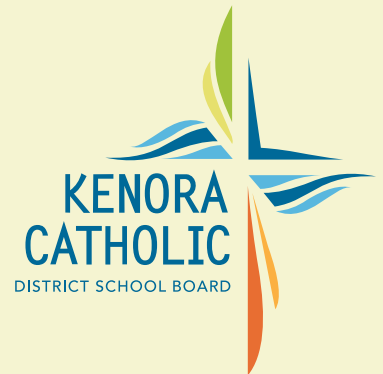
Their duties encompass not only setting policies but also ensuring high standards of educational excellence at the Kenora Catholic District School Board.

Board Meetings Open to the Public:

The public is welcome to attend our Board meetings, which take place on the third Tuesday of each month at 7:00 p.m., except in July and August. These meetings are held both at the Catholic Education Centre, 1292 Heenan Place, and virtually through Microsoft Teams.

The trustees are crucial in guiding the board, seamlessly integrating faith into key aspects like the school's mission, vision, strategic plans, policy development, and governance oversight.

Trustees, chosen by taxpayers in municipal elections, are responsible to their communities in Kenora, neighbouring First Nations, and Red Lake. Their term spans from November 15, 2022, to November 14, 2026, with the next municipal election scheduled for October 26, 2026.

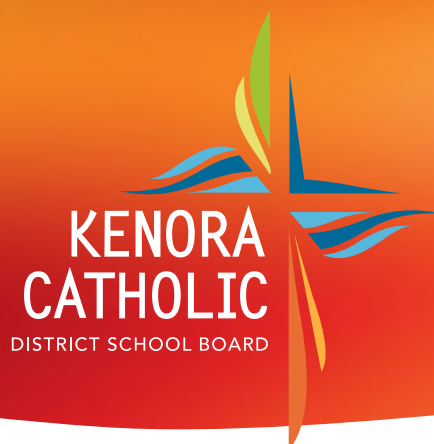
